What Happened to CCYPAC this year?

If you read the recently instituted set of Guidelines for **CCYPAC** in the attachments sent with the **May Stop & Reed** issue, you will understand part of the reason for no actual event this past May 19.

- 1) Most of our youngest local organists at present fall into either the new non-competitive Preparatory Division (grades 4-8) or
- 2) those very active past participants about to graduate from high school or college, distracted by finishing important projects and assignments, while preparing for their next chapter --- too busy to participate in the CCYPAC.

There were several Preparatory Division entrants, but only one competitive College applicant. This was a highly unusual situation in the history of CCYPAC. Since a competition requires at least two performers, it could not happen.

Dr. Andreas Werz, president of Keyboard Concerts,

which is our partner in this event, has graciously supported the board's decision to postpone CCYPAC until next season.

Our scholarship funds continue to grow, thanks to the monetary donations of so many of our AGO members and friends. There is a whole new generation of talented junior organists just around the corner who will gradually be eligible to compete in the High School Division, ready to receive prizes!

North Fresno Church Job Announcement

Position Title: Pastor of Worship and Music

North Fresno Church is seeking a person to serve on their pastoral staff. This Pastor of Worship and Music is responsible for giving leadership to all elements (except preaching) of North Fresno Church's classic service. Leadership includes planning the weekly service, directing the choir, leading worship and music, and equipping others to be involved in this ministry.

NFC is a member of the **Mennonite Brethren** denomination. The congregation has approximately 350-400 attendees in two services on a weekly basis, with a traditional style of worship in the **classic service** and **contemporary style** in the other (roughly 125 people attend the classic service and 250 attend the contemporary). The church is located in an **urban** area of Fresno, California, and takes a **missional posture** serving a community of diverse social, economic and ethnic individuals and families.

This is a **part-time position** (20 hours/week). Compensation will be adjusted for candidate's experience and education. Resumes will be accepted until the position is filled.

Guild Sunday

The Guild Sunday program will feature three graduating seniors. Matt Hartwig graduating from Washington Union, and as Valedictorian. Matt will continue his studies at Redlands majoring in Biology and minoring in Music, studying organ with Fred Swann. Thomas Melton Jr. will complete current studies at Fresno City College and will be attending Southern Adventist University studying Theology and Conducting. The School just happens to have a 4 manual John Brombaugh Tracker organ of 79 stops and 107 ranks. Cactus Harris has just graduated Fresno State with a degree in Music Cum Laude and will be returning for a masters in Conducting. Luke Shrestia graduates from Fowler High and will attend California State, Northridge studying commercial music with organ as principal instrument but he will be unable to attend because of Fowler baccalaureate. Congratulations go as well to Sheridan Haskell who graduated from Liberty University online and will continue studies in the Master of Music in Historical Performance program at Boston

University. Since the Easton Organ contains an antiphonal organ of six stops with a separate one manual and pedal console we will hear them used together. An added feature will be Baritone Extraordinaire **Earl Meyers**. Earl serves as organist of Central Seventh Day Adventist Church along with co organist **Thomas Melton Jr**.. You all will contribute as the great choir . We look forward to a great time.

The SJV/AGO Collegiate Scholarship, up to the amount of \$1500, may be awarded annually to a student enrolled for study of the organ. Requirements are based on AGO guidelines for earning of the Colleague-Level certificate, as posted yearly in the July issue of The American Organist and online at agohq.org. The American Guild of Organists will sponsor Dr. Margaret Aurora Licon in an organ recital to be held at First Presbyterian Church on Saturday, June 29, 2013 at 3:00 pm.

Admission is free but a free-will offering will be taken, the proceeds of which will go toward the AGO Student Scholarship Fund.

Featured on the program will be a specially commissioned work for organ and timpani composed by local composer and educator, Dr. Walter Saul, Professor of Music at Fresno Pacific University. Timpanist is Matt Cockrum of Clovis and trumpet will be played by First Pres Brass Conductor Max Hembd. Other organ selections include works by JS Bach, Herbert Howells, Kenneth Leighton and the program will conclude with the Toccata from the Fifth Organ Symphony of Widor.

The AGO plays a critical role in the contemporary church today by providing a venue for budding organists who will hopefully continue the sacred tradition of keeping the "King of Instruments" as an active participant in today's worship service. The program is dedicated toward building the scholarship fund that will support these young musicians.

Dr. Licon is the organist at First Presbyterian, a member of the AGO and a student of Richard Cencibaugh.
